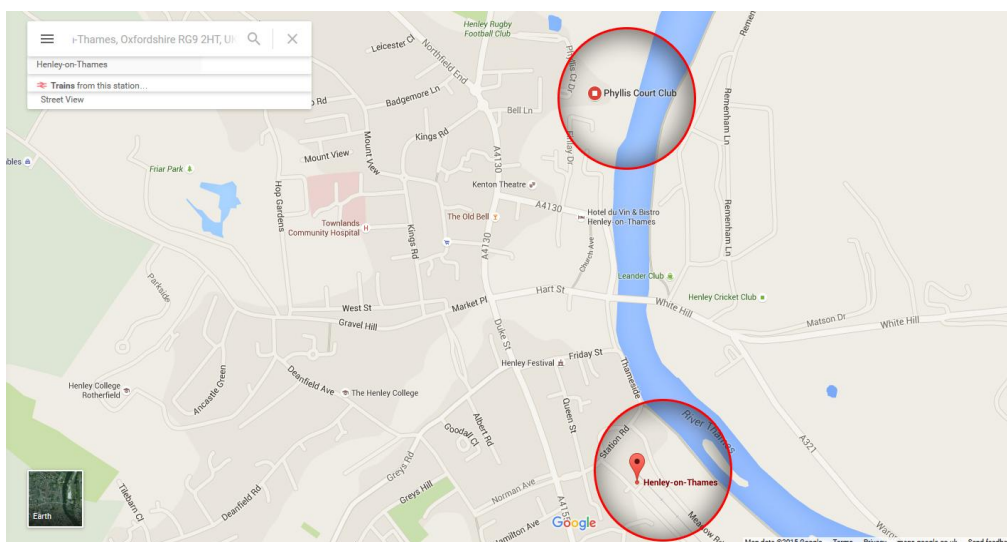
Henley is a 12th Century market town, surrounded by a beautiful rural landscape of wooded hills and green fields.
